Passport and Visa

Kindly note that some countries maintain that all visitors must hold a passport that is valid for at least 6 months from the date they return from the foreign country. Please check your status before issuing airline ticket.

As Portugal is part of the European Union, many visitors can enter the EU countries without a visa. A valid ID card or a passport is all you need to enter Lisbon.

Safety

Lisbon is considered a very safe city but you should take normal, sensible precautions to avoid mugging, bag snatching and pick pocketing. You should be extra vigilant at airports and railway stations. Do not leave valuables unattended. Most shops and all major taxi companies accept credit and debit cards, so there is no need to carry a lot of cash.

Shopping

Most street shops in Lisbon open from 9am to 10am, and often close at around 7pm.

Some offices and smaller businesses close for lunch, usually between 1pm to 3pm.

The shopping malls open their doors at 10am and only close at midnight.

Their large supermarkets however, close Sunday afternoons at 1pm.

On Saturdays, small shops generally open 9am to 1pm, and are closed on Sundays.

Most restaurants open between 7pm to 8pm, and stay open until 11pm or midnight. Lunch times vary, with some opening at around 11h-12h and serving until about 14h30-15h. All close for one day during the week, often on Sunday or Monday. Cafes are usually open from 7h in the morning onwards.

Currency

The local currency is the Euro(€).

Credit cards / Cash machines

All major credit cards are accepted widely, but not everywhere. If in doubt, ask in advance. Cash-on-card services are available from selected American Express, Diners Club, MasterCard and VisaCard addresses. These cards are also accepted by all GWK currency exchange outlets and Change Express Offices.



VAT

Value added tax (Imposto sobre o Valor Acrescentado - IVA) is paid at the time of purchase of a product or service. It is paid by everyone and there is no distinction between residents and non-residents.

About Lisbon

Lisbon (Lisboa), also known as the white city, thanks to its unique light, is the capital and largest city of Portugal, built on seven hills and boasting all the delights you would expect of the country's star attraction. The clear light and the kind climate allow for marvelous walks all over the city. The city has a beauty that extends beyond its famed monuments that can be experienced in the streets, and embraced by all the senses. Lisbon is one of the oldest cities in the world, and the oldest city in Western Europe predating other modern European capitals such as London, Paris and Rome by hundreds of years.

The city stretches along the northern bank of the river Tejo as it meets the Atlantic Ocean. As the landscape rises north away from the water, steep streets and stairways form the old tangled neighborhoods to green parks in the western suburbs can be found. Lisbon is the only European capital with sandy beaches 20 minutes away from the cobbled stone city center and a luxuriously green holy mountain around the corner.

Lisbon boasts a population of just over three million residents living in the metropolitan area and a land area of 958 km (370 sq mi), making the city the 11th most populous city in Europe. Lisbon is recognized as a global city



due to its importance in finance, commerce, media, entertainment, arts, international trade, education, and tourism. It is one of the major economic hubs within Europe, due to its growing financial sector and having one of the largest container ports on the European western coast.

Gothic cathedrals, majestic monasteries and quaint museums are all part of the colorful cityscape, but the real delights of discovery lie in wandering the narrow lanes of Lisbon's lovely backstreets. Lisbon must sees are: Alfama - the city's oldest district, Rossio the main square in Lisbon, which is the equivalent of Madrid's Puerta del Sol, Tokyo's Shibuya or London's Trafalgar Square. Principe Real, a trendy district with the fancy stores, Bairro Alto, viewpoint of stunning views of the city.
